What is human trafficking?

Human trafficking is the act of recruiting, transporting, or obtaining a person for compelled labor or commercial sex acts through the use of force, fraud, or coercion, or which a minor is involved.

SIGNS OF A POTENTIAL VICTIM:

- Accompanied by someone who prohibits the person from speaking or answering questions; refuses privacy.
- Appears malnourished or shows signs of physical abuse, unexplained injuries.
- Inconsistencies in personal history or seems coached / programmed.
- Excessively fearful, submissive, depressed, anxious, withdrawn, nervous, or paranoid behavior.
- Has few or no possessions; not in possession of their own documents.
- May have multiple hotel room keys and more than one cell phone.
- Wears expensive clothing or accessories that were “gifts”; inappropriate clothing for season and place.
- Mentions making a lot of money in a short period of time but can't state how.
- Is homeless due to running away, being forced to leave home, or otherwise displaced.
